Ranked as a silver medal course by Golf Magazine, Banff demands accuracy with well-placed traps to snare poor shots.

Signature Hole Comments: The Devil's Cauldron, a magnificent par 3 played from a tee perched high above a tiny clear emerald lake.

The Belfry's Brabazon Course is one of the best-known golf resorts in Great Britain and in 1993 was the site of the coveted Ryder Cup the spirited contest between professional golfers of the U.S. and Europe.

Meticulously and faithfully reproduced by the LINKS Design Team for computer play, The Belfry is a smashing addition to any Championship Course library! Jolly good golf right from your desktop.

Signature Hole Comments: An American style course created by Peter Alliss and Dave Thomas, the Brabazon's showpieces are the 10th hole, reachable with a long drive across a guarding lake by big hitters, and the 18th hole, which contains two water hazards, one from the tee and again, with the second shot, to a three-tiered green.

Bighorn Golf Club

A true desert course, Arthur Hills has incorporated natural rock formations, ravines and a desert wash as strategic components of play.

The first six holes offer a variety of elevations, climbing more than 1,000 feet through the Santa Rosa Mountains before tumbling back down into the desert. Tee boxes carved into natural rock outcroppings, fairways contoured into the mountainous terrain, and greens tucked back into natural coves present a most challenging golf experience.

The latter half of the course returns to a more traditional layout of rolling hills and valleys, water hazards and a couple of long par 5's which continue to test the golfer's skill.

Signature Hole Comments: Number 6 is a 505-yard par 4 providing a breathtaking view of the Coachella Valley. Due to the 100-foot drop from tee to fairway, accuracy rather than distance will prove more effective for positioning the second shot.

Bountiful Municipal Golf Course

Nestled in the shadows of the picturesque Wasatch Mountains, Bountiful Golf Club is one of the finest and most challenging golf venues in Utah. The course stretches out over rolling hillside terrain with a stunning view of the Great Salt Lake from almost every hole. "It'll break towards the lake," is a common tip from the locals to assist you in reading the break on the greens.

Signature Hole Comments: A 485 yard par 5. The green is reachable in two with a long drive and an accurate second shot. Your second shot must carry a grass-lined draw and then land softly on the hillside green just below the club house.

Castle Pines Golf Club

Jack Vickers had tried for more than eleven years to obtain the rolling pine-clad land near Castle Rock, Colorado. His dream?--a world-class golf course hosting a major professional tournament. His persistence was rewarded in the late seventies when approval was given to purchase the 5,000 acre tract of land about a half hour South and 1,000 feet above Denver. The first thing Vickers did was secure Jack Nicklaus as his architect. Within two years his vision--Castle Pines Golf Club-- opened in 1981 to strongly favorable reviews. It didn't take long before Vickers realized the other half of his dream. In 1986 Castle Pines was given a spot on the PGA Tour hosting The International, a unique tournament living up to its name, with a field of pros from all over the world.

Castle Pines is the longest course on the PGA Tour. It begins with the tour's longest hole, a 644 yard par-five that plays downhill. The hardest hole on the course is arguably the fifth hole going uphill the entire 477 yards with bunkers on both the drive and the approach. The beautiful 10th hole at Castle Pines is downhill with a lush fairway through deep stands of pine and oak--reminiscent of the 10th at Augusta--with one major difference, it's more difficult.

Signature Hole Comments: Number 18 features menacing bunkers, a Nicklaus signature feature.

Cog Hill Golf & Country Club

Cog Hill Golf & Country Club is a privately owned, open to the public, golf complex located 30 miles southwest of Chicago. The facility includes four regulation 18-hole courses. At the championship level is Course No. 4, "Dubsdread", home of the Motorola Western Open. Since it opened in 1964, it has become one of the PGA Tour players' favorite golf courses--and one of the most challenging. The 7,073 yard par 72 course is ranked among Golf Digest magazine's Top 100 courses in the United States.

Dubsdread is known for its demanding shots and acres of natural beauty. Tight landing areas, combined with heavily bunkered large rolling greens make this course a test for the best.

Signature Hole Comments: A long par 3 with a two-tiered green that slopes toward the front and is surrounded by six deep sand bunkers.

Completely redesigned in 1959 by Robert Trent Jones, Firestone's South Course has become one of the premier stops on the PGA Tour. In 1960 the South Course played host to the PGA Championship, and is presently the home of the NEC World Series of Golf. Every August top professionals from around the world come to Akron, Ohio to face the challenge of one of the most demanding courses in the world.

Signature Hole Comments: Number 16 is a long par 5. Most players hold back on their second shot to get more control with a full-on shot on the third.

Harbour Town

Harbour Town Golf Links has been variously described as "Pebble Beach East", "Pine Valley South" and "St. Andrews with Spanish Moss". Though each of these courses is vastly different, each draws a valid comparison to Harbour Town, illustrating how challenging and magnificent this course is.

Winding through the dense forests of pine, oak, and magnolia, carpeted in Spanish moss, Harbour Town offers a challenge to even the best golfers. The strategic placement of greens and hazards make every shot count and par difficult to achieve.

Test your golfing abilities on this masterful recreation of Harbour Town Golf Links and judge for yourself the grandeur of one of South Carolina's most difficult courses.

Signature Hole Comments: The 18th hole reminds golfers of the 18th hole at Pebble Beach. Sneaking around the edge of Calibogue Sound, the tee, fairway, and green jut out into the salt marshes making a slice or hook a critical mistake. The 465 yards to the green can be impossible to reach in two shots given a high wind and behind the green, the red-and-white striped lighthouse, the Harbour Town trademark, rises into the air, for a scenic finishing hole.

Innisbrook

Innisbrook, of Tarpon Springs, Florida, is one of the country's truly great golf destinations. Here, 63 holes of championship golf wind through a thousand acres of gently rolling hills and lush pine forest--a setting more reminiscent of the Carolinas than Florida's west central coast. And of the three championship courses that call Innisbrook home, Copperhead is its finest.

By anyone's standards, Copperhead is a world-class challenge. It's been ranked by Golf Digest as one of "America's Greatest", Florida's #1 course for 6 consecutive years by Golfweek, and is the site of The J.C. Penney Classic.

Designed by master Architect E. Lawrence Packard, Copperhead's 7,031 yards have been magnificently reproduced by the Course Design Team in exacting detail to challenge you day or night, year-round. However, be warned! Copperhead is a beautiful but dangerous viper. Beneath its serene and meticulously manicured exterior, Copperhead is poised and ready to strike at any moment!

Kapalua - Bay Course

From the black-lava peninsula to the white sands of Oneola Bay, this tropical 6,761-yard, par 72 course has been rendered to perfection with the meticulous attention to detail that can only be found in the courses of Links LS. Designed by Arnold Palmer, the Kapalua Bay Course includes panoramic views of the Pacific from almost every hole.

Rated 15th "Best in State" in 1995 by Golf Digest, the Kapalua Bay course provides a unique challenge to every golfer's skill level. The Bay Course is characterized by rolling and hilly terrain; 68 bunkers total; and 8 water hazards.

Signature Hole Comments: This par three hole promises to be one of the most dramatic golf holes in the world! Your tee shot must carry 100 yds over the Pacific onto a well-guarded green. This down wind approach leaves many golf shots in the bunkers that flank the back of the green.

Kapalua - Plantation Course

The Kapalua Resort's newest course, the par 73, 7,263-yard Plantation Course, presents Kapalua's ultimate golf challenge. Designed by Ben Crenshaw and Bill Coore and opened in 1991, The Plantation Course unfurls across island canyons, native vegetation and panoramic oceanfront plateaus.

Its expansive fairways, elevation changes, natural terrain and large putting surfaces embody traditional aspects of a seaside links course. A shotmaker's dream, players will find that the use of imagination -- and every club in their bag -- is an asset here. The Plantation Course boasts large-scale terrain features: deep valleys; expansive greens and fairways; 95 bunkers total; no water hazards.

Signature Hole Comments: The hole around which the rest of the course was formulated, the eighteenth is an extremely long downhill, downwind par 5. At 663 yards this is the longest hole on the PGA tour. Despite its length, the hole is made reachable in two powerful blows by the assisting winds and slope. The fairway and green are large and receptive, yet difficult to judge, owing to the vast panorama and scale of the background. The eighteenth is probably the most scenic, spectacular and representative of all holes at the Plantation Course. Its scale and drama are uncommon and its challenge is within reason, while its surrounding beauty is unparalleled.

Kapalua - Village Course

The Village course twists, turns, rises and falls through the West Maui Mountains. A serene trek through forested Hawaiian headlands, historic stands of Cook pines and eucalyptus remain scattered throughout the course.

This course is complex enough to challenge the seasoned professional yet can be every bit as enjoyable for beginning golfers as well. The Village Course rises to 800 feet above sea level. It provides hilly terrain with links-style playability; 61 bunkers total with 4 water hazards.

Signature Hole Comments: Don't let the yardage fool you. A slight dogleg left, encourages a short tee shot short of the large eucalyptus tree. Don't be distracted by the view - a tranquil man made lake stocked with grass carp (some as large as 40 pounds) scores high with players, but hopefully not on their scorecard.

Latrobe Country Club

Latrobe Country Club's current design was heavily influenced by both Deke and Arnold Palmer. The course has matured into a beautiful and demanding test of golf, thanks primarily to the diligence and constant care of Deke Palmer, second son Jerry, current superintendent Martin Repko and their experienced grounds crews and the planting of many thousands of pines and other trees over the years on the club's 110 acres.

The progress of course improvement along with other modernization and expansion of the club's physical plant, was accelerated following Arnold Palmer's purchase of the club in September of 1971. The course and structures on the grounds have been constantly upgraded with many of the holes revised, a modern automatic irrigation system installed, permanent cart paths constructed and a practice range created.

Mauna Kea

The Mauna Kea course is one of the most dramatic and challenging ever designed by noted architect Robert Trent Jones, Sr. Built in 1964 on a 5,000 year-old lava flow from Mauna Kea (mountain), the piece de resistance is the magnificent third hole, which is one of the most challenging and most photographed over-the-water shots in the world. This renowned par-3 features an opening drive over a surging Pacific inlet.

To build this rugged beauty, rolling over 170 acres of gently sloping terrain, Jones had to clear away tough indigenous vegetation. Then, using crushed lava and coral reclaimed from the area, Jones developed fairways and greens that resemble a lush carpet, studded by flowers and trees amidst a volcanic desert.

Mauna Kea is ranked among "America's 100 Greatest" by *Golf Digest* and has received the coveted "Gold Medal" award as one of the 12 "Best Golf Resorts in America," from *Golf* magazine. Photographed in the late spring by our Links Design Team, this digitized version of world-renown Mauna Kea captures the stunning beauty of Hawaii's flora and fauna in their full bloom and most vibrant colors.

Oakland Hills Country Club is one of the world's mainline golf courses. Since its very beginnings in the early 1920s, Oakland Hills has made its mark in the annals of golf history.

It was remodeled by Robert Trent Jones, 1950, 1972, 1984.

It was at the 1951 US Open that it received its nickname, "The Monster." Only two players that year had rounds under par. Ben Hogan's 287 total won the Open and caused him to exclaim his joy at having "brought this course, this monster, to its knees."

Signature Hole Comments: Considered by many to be the toughest finishing hole in golf.

Pelican Hill Golf Club

Once you're at the tee on the Ocean Course at Pelican Hill Golf Club, you'll easily see why this seaside golfing paradise was named The Best New Resort Course by *Golf Digest* in January, 1993.

Carved into the canyons and bluffs north of Crystal Cove in Newport Coast, California, this Tom Fazio designed course features the Pacific as a backdrop on every hole.

Although its \$175 green fees would discourage many, Pelican Hill has played close to capacity since the first day it opened on November 16, 1991. From Bermuda fairways lined by eucalyptus and pine trees, to dramatic canyon-crossing tee shots, The Ocean Course at Pelican Hill is 6,634 yards of golfing splendor.

Signature Hole Comments: Two of Pelican Hill's more memorable holes are the 16th and 18th, the latter being a quintessential finishing hole with the tee box chiseled into the canyon wall. It requires a 175-yard first drive over a chasm to make the fairway and then the dogleg right forces golfers to hit back over the winding canyon again.

The 16th hole looks like the last golf hole on the edge of the earth across a canyon on the point of a knoll sits a lone Toyon tree with the flag silhouetted by the ocean. Play it once and its lonely beauty will be forever etched in your memory.

Pinehurst Resort & Country Club is recognized as one of the finest golf resorts in the world. With seven championship courses tucked away in a North Carolina forest, it is truly a golfer's paradise. The most famous of the seven is Pinehurst number Two. This championship layout was designed by Donald Ross and is said to be his finest work.

Pinehurst Number Two stretches out over an imposing 7,028 yards with a par of 72. Rolling terrain, tree-lined fairways and undulating greens add to the challenge of this beautiful links. Over the years, Pinehurst Number Two has hosted PGA and Amateur Championships along with the Ryder Cup.

Pinehurst Number Two is now home of the PGA Tour Championship, the grand finale of the U.S. Tour.

Prairie Dunes Country Club

"A touch of Scotland in the Land of Oz. Sunflowers instead of heather. Oceans of grain instead of the sea. But, like Scotland, be prepared, the wind always blows." These are the poetic words of golf pro Tom Watson describing the course at Prairie Dunes Country Club in Hutchinson, Kansas.

Prairie Dunes can hardly be farther from the sea and yet it is known as a "seaside" course because of its rolling sandhills, characteristic of a true Scottish links. Vaunted by professionals as one of America's toughest courses, Prairie Dunes is a course for thinkers, rewarding good shots and punishing the weaker ones. Built in 1937 by Perry Maxwell at the height of the Depression, the course is blended intuitively into the natural terrain creating treacherous and well protected greens with severe roughs.

Prairie Dunes is ranked among the top 20 courses in America; its number 8 and 10 holes make most golfing publication's list of the greatest golf holes in America.
