**Notes:** The Judge plays alongside the glistening backwaters of the Alabama River. The first tee lies 200 feet above the fairway overlooking the Alabama River and the skyline of Montgomery. With 14 holes adjoining the water and a stunning island greens, the Judge is described as simply magnificent and provides some of the most spectacular scenery and golf holes in the world.

## Hole by hole descriptions and Out of Bounds Lines

### No1 Par 4

The first shot on this hole may dictate how you play this course. Perched high above the fairway driver is often unnecessary but if you get one away down the middle this hole plays pretty straightforward from the fairway. Do we need to point out the water?

### No2 Par 4

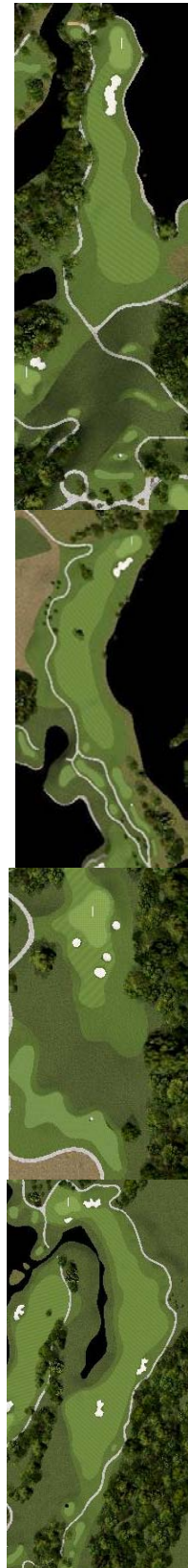
Depending on what tee block you play this hole from this can be an awkward tee shot. A lone tree in the fairway adds just that last element from the back tees. The best play is down the left with a power fade.

### No3 Par 3

If you are having trouble so far, this hole is some welcome relief. Fly the ball past the pot bunkers for what should be an easy par.

### No4 Par 5

Play down the right with a soft draw for best results here. Some players choose to get one over to the adjacent fairway (5<sup>th</sup>) but be aware of the water for your approach either way.



**No5 Par 4**

If you are having problems with your driver, leave it in your bag for this hole. The obvious water to the right forces players down the left but the trees are nasty, so stay out of them or be prepared to hit out sideways or worse.

**No6 Par 3**

OK so now it starts to get interesting. Get the right stick in your hand your pay the price here. Pay attention to the pin location and either take play longer for front pins or play shorter for back pins. Anything over played over the green is wet.

**No7 Par 5**

This is the first of several monster par fives from the back tees. Hopefully you are hitting your driver well because anything right will mean three off the tee.

**No8 Par 4**

A sigh of relief after the last hole. Just keep it out of the trees for a fairly easy par.



**No9 Par 4**

Grip it and rip it here. Probably the widest fairway on the course.

**No10 Par 5**

No significant water here but the trees left and right must be avoided. From the back tees this one is a real monster.

**No11 Par 4**

Check the carry distance over the water because it probably shouldn't really be in play. Clear the hazard and have a short approach. Birdie here.

**No12 Par 3**

A difficult shot here but take an extra club for safety.



**No13 Par 4**  
Dog Leg right.

The pond on the dogleg snares plenty of balls. Often the second shot here is the most awkward.

**No16 Par 3**  
Often the bunkers on this hole are a saviour.



**No17 Par 4**

A tricky penultimate hole. The tee shot must go down the middle. If you are struggling to this point take an iron off the tee for safety.

**No18 Par 4**

Only short but don't be tempted. The water protects the green well for any long hitters thinking of hitting this green. Take an iron for position and play a wedge for a chance at birdie.
